Ohio Loses Its Oldest Pilgrim



At about one-ten o'clock on June 1, 1961, Charles Edward Cox walked out the House of God at Mooseheart a Pilgrim, representing the state of Ohio and his beloved Coshocton Moose Lodge 935.

On Monday, September 19, 2011, he left this life to join that Great Lodge above, dying at age 88.

Pilgrim Brother Ed enrolled at Lodge 935 on March 21, 1944. He became a Moose Legionnaire on January 29, 1950. He was elevated to the Fellowship Degree Aug. 23, 1956.

He had been a member of the 25 Club since 1959.

One may read Pilgrim Brother Ed's Ohio Moose contribution in the booklet published in 2001 entitled *History in Progress: Putting the Pieces in Place!*. He served as Association President in 1964-65. One later learns that after his presidency, Pilgrim Brother Ed continued his active role in the OSMA by serving as Acting Pilgrim Governor preceding Richard Wolfe of Dover 707.

Pilgrim Services were held on Monday, September 26, 2011. Graveside services immediately followed.

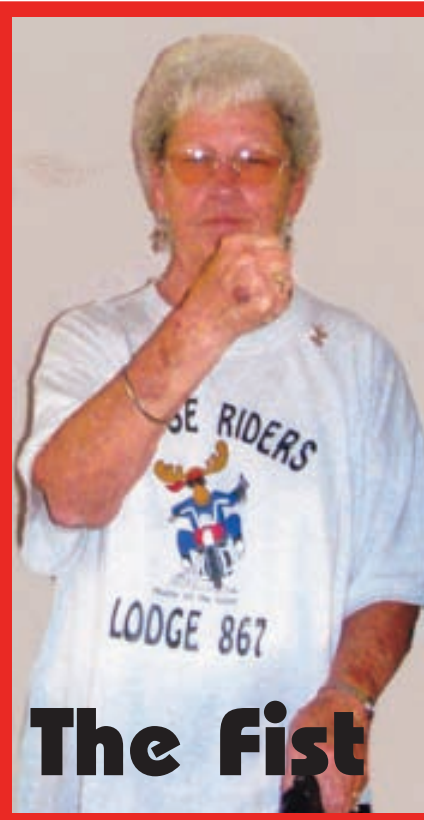
