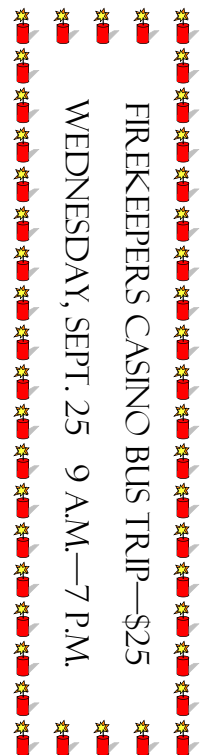
Donations collected over the years have been put aside for this project but any further contributions would be greatly appreciated.
